With regard to trying to increase the membership base. I believe the continued strength of the integrity programme is a boost, ideas have come forward for a Young Drivers Development Programme and also the idea for Harness Racing 'Red Letter' have-a-go-driving days is being explored. Exposure of the sport was excellent in 2016 with Chelmsford, Musselburgh, Newcastle and Wolverhampton thoroughbred racecourses all staging Harness Racing. This is what we will be working with Promoters to continue and to open the sport to new eyes and fresh blood.

I will continue to support as many race meetings as possible in 2017, where I will always be available for members to chat with me and raise any issues.
