DIRECTORS UPDATE

The AGM was held back in December at Manchester Airport but unfortunately had to be attended mainly by Zoom due to the on-going covid regulations. It saw the first election of officers by you the members. We decided as a Board of Directors that in order to encourage members to vote we would use what could be considered old fashioned, a postal method, with all returns being handled by our accountants, who relayed the results of the vote to us all on the day.

As a Board we felt it imperative that members had trust in the voting system, by using the accountants, who cross checked eligibility to vote, vote counting, but importantly who handled the confidentiality of the data, we felt that we ensured the system was as professional as it could be.

We said goodbye to Darren Owen, Ryan O'Neil and George Button who due to personal reasons did not offer themselves for re-election. As a Board we would like to thank them for all their hard work during their tenure of office. We miss you, and enjoyed working with you. We also welcomed Tamsin Towe, Hayley Cassells and Charles Inglis.

Integrity is always an area of conversation for all licence holders, none more so than this year with 6 positive tests being returned. Most of these cases have now been dealt with. There continues to be questions about the length of time it takes to process cases. We patiently have to say, time and time again, it takes the time it takes. Both parties have an entitlement to time to prepare their case, cases have to be heard by an external panel, a process has to be followed. What is more important is that a fair result is achieved.

We continue to strive for a clean sport, and our thanks go to our dedicated team who work tirelessly. The team are recognised by other equine disciplines, and over the winter have been working with a number of organisations nationally and internationally to identify further improvements that could be made, including out of competition testing.

There has been statements on social media about how two cases that are the same can be treated so differently, we would like to, point out that no two cases are the same. Our external panels have access to BHRC case law, Rules and Regulations and of course the full case notes. They are professional people who in our opinion have come to a 'fair' outcome. Both parties have the opportunity to appeal should they be unhappy with a decision. It is not until we are out of this appeal time that we release any information.

As most licence holders are aware our old ALFIE database was crumbling, and without Dai John Edwards working tirelessly last year (manually checking ratings) we would have struggled. The BHRC and IHRA have entered into a contract with Equine Medi-Record to have a new bespoke program designed. We are hoping when this is fully operational that we will be able to offer an improved service to all.

Our new computer system will need some different data, we have therefore changed many of our forms. This along with the new computer system did delay the start of the licensing process. We did not accept or demand licences be renewed early in the new year as we were not in a position to process them, it would therefore be unfair to take your money and not process your application. We have also, following

feedback from licence holders looked at our licensing procedure. All licence applications and renewals have gone to a panel first for approval. Most licences will go through the panel quickly and with no further action. Unfortunately a handful of applications will undergo further review, and in a worst case scenario a licence may not be renewed or renewed but with a clause attached to it.

We asked for suggested rule changes. The Board spent considerable time collating these and wording them in an acceptable format. These were then discussed at the latest Members Meeting and are available on the website. They will be incorporated in to the rule book which will then be uploaded to the website. Paper copies are being printed for stewards and will be available for track stewards through each committee. Should any individual require a paper copy these are available from the office at a cost of £10.

At the AGM Darren Owen proposed that Track Stewards should have an entitlement to a vote (should they not already have one). The plan is for this to be voted on at the Spring Members Meeting. Assuming this gets over the line we will need a register of all stewards, and we will also need a record of when/where stewards have officiated. We are therefore asking that all stewards complete an application form.

It is with great sadness that we hear that there will be no Musselburgh Races this year. We know that Anthony Fettah has invested a lot of time and effort to keep this prestigious fixture alive. We have too been working to try to support that work and will continue to do so. Our desire to do this is to try to keep one of our jewels in the crown, The Famous Musselburgh Pace alive. We have heard rumours of a

silent protest at the track, but we do not support this in any way. It is not that we are spineless, it is not that we don't care, but we worry that it is counter productive, and could alienate not only Musselburgh Racecourse but also with other racecourses and the BHA.

Social media can be used as a positive way to promote our sport, many local groups have well followed profiles and share some exciting content. Unfortunately last year there were occasions when a few individuals overstepped the mark. We ask you to familiarise yourself with rule S40 and our Social Media Policy, and explain to you that although we believe in freedom of speech, we will not tolerate the abuse from a minority of licence holders that we experienced last year.

The 1st January saw the splitting of the governance of our sport. TrotBritain now govern the trotting arm of the sport whilst the BHRC remain in governance of the pacing arm. There have been several meetings of the two organisations under the umbrella organisation HRBGB chaired by Brant Dunshea of BHA. Further details are in this publication.

Awards evening, we have finally been able to have an 'in person' event, there was certainly a feel good factor to it. Our congratulations go to all the very deserving winners, and our thanks go to Sarah Thomas, Darren Owen, Mandy Stanley, Gwenan Thomas and Julie Park for organising the event.

Life as a Director is harder than you can ever envisage. It takes up hours of your time each week. The Directors all would like to thank the licence holders for their support either by voting for them, or through the kind words at the Awards Evening. It makes the hard work worth it.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

Everyone loves a grey, and Coalford Laag was probably the most famous grey pacer in Britain. A truly world-class racehorse and a highly successful stallion, he has been the horse of a lifetime for Coalford Stud.

Coalford Laag was foaled at Coalford Stud out of the mare Clairichatross who was purchased from the Harrisburg Sale, in foal to Laag. He raced in 1995 and he was the winner of all 4 of his starts, which included the National Pacing Futurity in a Stakes record time of 2.02. Coalford Laag won a qualifier at York in 2.00 at 2 vears old. Due to his talent and speed, he was then sent to race in Canada and USA as a 3 vear old under the care of Hall of Fame trainer, Stew Firlotte. Coalford Laag went on to win his first 7 starts in Canada as a 3 year old in various stakes races. His racing highlight in USA would be racing against the world's best colts in the Oliver Wendell Holmes Pace on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands in 1996.

Coalford Laag returned home with a lifetime record of 1.52 and over £60,000 in money won. He subsequently started

a very successful stallion career, siring winners including Coalford Bubbagump p.2.02, Coalford Amoretto p.1.59, Coalford Tracey p.2.00, Coalford Honour p.2.02, Meadowbranch Gigolo p.2.02, Coalford Admiral p.1.59, to name but a few. A number of his progeny were exported to race in Canada and the US including Coalford Admiral p.1.54, Coalford Delight p.1.53 and Meadowbranch Gigolo p.1.54.

It is a rarity for a British stallion to have had two top class careers as both a racehorse and a stallion, but Coalford Laag made it so. Possibly the most famous grey standardbred ever known to the UK, he was as kind and as beautiful as he was talented. Everyone who saw him never forgot him, a truly majestic animal who lives long in the hearts and memories of anvone who loves harness racing. As they say, 'Legends never die.' Thank you, Coalford Laag; you were indeed one of a kind. A worthy nominee into the BHRC Hall of Fame.

At the age of 82 Peter is still giving his time freely to various charity meetings and in our eyes is a worthy nomination into the BHRC Hall of Fame.



... Bob Meadowcroft (NZ) ...

Harness Racing in New Zealand is going through a quiet time at present leading up to the big Easter Cup meetings and "The Race" a new event worth \$900,000 to be run at Cambridge on the 14th April over 2200 meters mobile. Nine horses will line up with 2 coming over from Australia. With 5 or 6 meetings weekly there is still plenty of Harness racing albeit lower class horses for punters to wager on.

This year's yearling sales just completed last month broke all records with the aggregate up11% on last year over the 4 days of the sales.

Stonewall Stud were big buyers purchasing 2 of the top lots by Bettors Delight for over \$200,000. With buyers from the USA active it showed the industry to be in good heart considering due to Covid restrictions the lack of Australian buyers. The sales however were beamed live around the world and a lot of horses were sold online.

NZ and Australia have just seen the completion of the "Team Teal" series run for lady drivers from both countries.

Back in 2016 Duncan McPherson a



keen Harness racing fan lost his wife to Ovarian cancer and he decided to raise money via the lady drivers for research into Ovarian cancer. In 2018 NZ female drivers joined in and every lady driver in both countries wore teal coloured driving pants.

The fund raising finished this week raising more than \$12,000 in NZ.

Every time a lady driver won HRNZ
Donated \$100 along with \$100 from
Woodland Stud plus the girls
donated a percentage of their
winnings. Altogether the NZ ladies
won 53 races over the approx 6
weeks. The leading lady being 21 yr
old Sarah O'Reilly with 11 wins.



With autumn now here and winter a few weeks away grass track racing is winding down. NZ grass tracks are mostly shared with galloping clubs and the two codes work in well together. Quite a few of the big galloping tracks have all weather trotting tracks inside the grass tracks. Most are 1200 meters with quite a few over longer than that in distance. Some Harness tracks also have greyhound tracks inside them. It makes sense utilising facilities for all codes.

The race day facilities also cater for many horses at each track so there is no tying horses to boxes waiting to race. All tracks have good wash down facilities, some providing warm water. In a typical weekend 150 horses are listed to race at one of the grass tracks at

Motukarara. Three days before only 100 odd will race at the premiere track Addington so that gives an indication of how popular grass track racing is (in good weather!). The fields are much larger than the all-weather tracks. Quite common to see 16 plus on the big grass tracks.

Junior drivers are well catered for. Starting in January junior drivers (must be aged under 25 at Jan 22) will be competing for points throughout the season to qualify for finals to be held in Nov/ December, and then go to Australia to compete in the Australasia Junior driver Championship.

Getting back to Tregaron this year.


What bit of advice would you give a young driver?

One of the awards was the hotly-contested Tim Tetrick Drive of the Year award – once again supported by world renowned driver Tim Tetrick. 4. How did you get into harness racing?

My stepdad Derry has always been involved in harness racing in Cork and that lead me to become interested in the sport. I didn't actually have anything to do with Standardbreds until I was 15. I just started out riding in saddle races with Rhyds Dilemma and Fairdays Bret.

5. Have you had much experience driving?

I've been driving since 2017, I did my 3 qualifying drives in Ireland again with Rhyds Dilemma. I won my first ever race and a few seconds within the first few races I drove in. When at home in Ireland I jog 5/6 every day so it's good experience.

6. Are there any tracks or races that are on your bucket list to drive/win at?

Appleby was always one where I wanted to win because I've always raced on grass tracks in Ireland so that was special last year. Hopefully this year I would like get a win at York if I can.

7. How was your time working for John and Vicky Gill?

The Gills are great very nice people with a great knowledge of the sport so it was nice to get an insight into that last year. I'm back again for 2022 so hopefully we can get a few more wins and have a good year.

8. Will we be seeing you back in the UK in 2022?

Yes I'm back in the UK for 2022, I loved being able to meet new people in the sport over here and really enjoyed my time last year so I'm back again.

9. Tell us a little bit about your own horses and plans for the coming year.

Well I currently own 2 horses, Stateside Fortune and Ayr Beach. Unfortunately they both broke their pedal bone last season which was a disaster for me. They've both healed well so far; my filly has gone back to Ireland and will have the year off at home. Ayr Beach is still in the UK, there hasn't been any plans made as yet but we'll know more in about a month or so.



Hugh O'Neil Jnr, a former Tim Tetrick Drive of the Year award winner and part of the successful team at Ayr Standardbreds, has recently made the move to the USA in pursuit of his dream to become a professional harness racing driver. He is currently based in Florida working with Altmeyer Wilder Racing (Mike Wilder and Dan Altmeyer). Sarah Thomas caught up with him to find out how he's settling in and what led him to cross the Atlantic to become part of the biggest racing industry in the world:

1. How long have you wanted/ planned to head abroad to try to forge a career as a driver?

Around the age of 11/12 I wanted to go to the States and drive, we used to visit a lot of friends abroad and it was always a dream of mine to come over here and try and race horses for a living. It's my biggest passion, my parents were a huge help in pushing me to chase after something I've always wanted to do and have always supported me as well.

2. What led you to work with Mike (Wilder) and Dan (Altmeyer)?

I got in talks with Mike and his wife Heather (through my brother Michael who was friends with them) around May/June 2021 and when they offered for me to come over and work with them I jumped at the chance to work with such great, established and well thought of people.

3. How are you finding your current job in Florida? What does the role





involve?

It's honestly a dream job and I couldn't be happier at the position I am in with Altmeyer Wilder Racing. I currently jog and train the 2-year-olds and 3yearolds and have been lucky enough to sit behind some really nice horses.

4. What does a typical day consist of?

Right now, I've been trying to get to the gym early in the mornings before I go to the barn at 6.15am. We look over all of the horses and then jogging starts at 7am.

There are 3 of us jogging with a barn of 20, so we are usually finished and leave the barn around 11.30am. On training days when we go two trips sometimes we are there a little later.

After that I basically just relax, go to the pool or out for lunch. There are a lot of nice places to eat here like on the St John's river, or friends of Mike's have taken us out on their boat so there's always something to do.

5. Are there any horses you've worked with so far that you really like?

There are a lot of really nice horses in the barn right now so it's hard for me to pick just one. I do really like the twoyear-old colt Lou On The Beach (Sweet Lou) and there is a two year-old filly Baywatch Hanover (Betting Line) who I think is pretty special. For the three year -olds it probably has to be Lone Wolf American (American Ideal) who I won my first qualifier with.

6. What has been the biggest difference between working in the States and working at home that you've noticed so far?

The biggest difference so far I'd have to say is the weather, to get the chance to train babies and 3-year-olds in the Florida sunshine every day and call it work is just amazing to me. As most people will know I had a full time job at home in Scotland and worked with our horses around that so being able to just do horses full time is a dream come true.

7. How have other trainers at Spring Garden Ranch welcomed you?

All the trainers at SGR have been amazing. I've had the chance to sit behind some really nice horses for training miles, not only for Dan and Mike but for other guys like Kelly O'Donnell,





Howard Parker and Brian Brown (who gave me my first start in a qualifier in the USA). He's listed me to drive the filly again in another qualifier and I'm really grateful for the opportunities that I'm being given.

I also had my first winner for Altmeyer Wilder racing in my second qualifier aboard Lone Wolf American recently which was a brilliant experience.

8. You attended the Dan Patch awards recently with Mike and Heather - any highlights from the evening?

The Dan Patch was amazing from start to finish but just being in the presence of guys I've looked up to like John Campbell and getting to sit and talk to them. It was incredible and slightly surreal.

9. What's the next step for you?

My plan is to leave Florida on April 23rd and go to the Meadows [Pennsylvania] to continue working for Mike and Dan and then hopefully pick up some drives and see how it goes

from there. I'm very excited for that part!

10. What's the best piece of advice you've been given so far and by whom?

Probably the best advice was from Dan and Mike which was "don't say too much and always listen", and also from my dad which was "work hard and keep my head down".

11. What advice would you give aspiring drivers looking to follow in your footsteps?

The only advice I could give is 'do it'. I know it might seem like a big step but unless you do it you'll never know and for me it's the best thing I've ever done coming to America.

12. What are your goals for 2022?

My goals for 2022 are to hopefully pick up some drives, keep working hard, win as many races as possible and to keep learning every day.

BHRC contact the host lab and receiving lab and arrangement for shipment (this can take approximate time 2+ weeks just for shipment and a further month for result

BHRC prepare letter to Responsible Person (RP) asking for any reason for the positive test

Suggested approximate time (3 days)

The Responsible Person then has **two weeks** to submit in writing any explanation to the BHRC


EVENWOOD SONOFAGUN

The return of a legend – Evenwood Sonofagun

Over the past few years UK harness racing fans have become used to seeing some of our sport's best horses making the journey across the Atlantic to race in North America. Some people feared this apparent exodus would be detrimental to the sport here, while others felt the success of British and Irish horses overseas would in fact boost our profile on the world stage. Personally speaking, I fall into the latter camp. I have also thoroughly enjoyed watching race replays and keeping track of results for some of the former stars of British harness racing.

One horse in particular whose overseas career I have followed closely is none other than dual Crock of Gold winner, world record holder and BHRC Hall of Famer EVENWOOD SONOFAGUN, aka 'Gunner'.

Following a career here in the UK where he amassed an impressive 26 wins, including six Group 1s, Evenwood Sonofagun departed for Canada back in 2019. The year wasn't out before he recorded his first win at Mohawk with Rocker Laidler on board, having flown over to take the drive, on 30th November. He followed this up with a second win and provided an early Christmas present for connections on 21st December.



Another 4 wins were added to his tally in early 2020 before the pandemic closed down racing in Canada. Upon racing commencing again in June he notched up a further 2 wins to make it six for 2020, with his return to the winner's circle on 6th June heralding a new lifetime mark of 1.49.2. Racing was intermittently affected by lockdowns, but despite racing at the top level for almost all of his time in Canada, and with a brief stint in the USA at Hoosier Park under the care of Jamie Macomber, Gunner went on to score twice in 2021 with trainer Colin Johnson at Mohawk before his time there was wrapped up.

Alexis Laidler had assured me from the outset that when Gunner's time

abroad was done, he would return to Britain and despite his former stablemate Matticulous fetching an incredible \$150,000 when offered for sale, connections stayed true to their word. At the end of September last year, after a long journey by air and across land, Gunner returned to the place I think we can all agree is his home: Merrington Stables. Stabled in the first stall in the barn as you enter and next to the stable's other big star Merrington Movinup, Gunner stands as the talisman once again for the Laidler team. Despite a career spanning 7 seasons and 36 wins in 3 countries, a sub-1.50 lifetime mark and a world record to

his name, the story isn't yet over for Gunner: British harness racing fans can expect to see him return to the track here in 2022 as it has been confirmed that he is back in training for the forthcoming season.

I for one can't wait to see him again doing what he does best. He may have a few more miles on the clock and find himself eligible for veteran races now at the ripe old age of 10, but Gunner is the epitome of the phrase 'form is temporary, class is permanent' – so here's to a successful eighth consecutive season of racing!

Welcome to the new era for Trotting and Pacing in Great Britain

On 1 January 2022, the TROTBritain became the Governing Body of Trotting in Great Britain and the BHRC the Governing Body of Pacing. The two organisations are the equal members of the Harness Racing Board of Great Britain (HRBGB). HRBGB is the platform where the BHRC and TROTBritain will jointly make decisions on matters defined as being of common interest to Pacing and Trotting.

In fact, TROTBritain will refer to itself officially as the Governing Body of Trotting Horseracing. This usage is necessary to affirm that trotting is not just a 'horse sport', but indisputably a form of horseracing. In fact it is the biggest form of horseracing in most of Europe, on all indicators, including betting. It is also essential that our horses are treated as racehorses whenever they are moving inside, or between, countries

TROTBritain looks forward to a collaboration which proves to be a winwin for both gaits. We fully recognise and accept that many people are involved in both pacing and trotting. Their institutional separation need pose no problem for either going forward, so long as the very clear distinction between them is part of everyone's mindset.

The principles

The basic principle, made clear in the Dunshea Agreement, and the Terms of Reference for HRBGB, is that in determining policy on matters of common interest, there is equality between trotting and pacing - between TROTBritain and the BHRC. This may lead to the same policies, or to different policies, as HRBGB decides, HRBGB has already had four successful meetings, settled several important issues and made good progress on others. The current BHRC representatives are Jason Podmore, John Towe and Will Evans. TROTBritain is represented by Bill Green, Jack Dowie and Mike Evans.

In relation to the **implementation** of policies, the basic principles that are consistently insisted on by TROTBritain are **procedural efficiency** and **proportionate financing**. A sustainable and flourishing future requires both organisations to be **agile and lean**. Accordingly, from the beginning we will be scrutinising and evaluating all current procedures of the BHRC to determine to what extent we agree to use their services and finance them out of trotting revenue – or to self-service. We see benefits to pacing participants from such scrutiny.

The transitional year

2022 will be a year of transition. In relation to most of the common matters

that come under the aegis of HRBGB, we envisage things remaining substantially unchanged as far as participants are concerned. During the year, however, TROTBritain will be establishing the revenue and cost bases of major changes that will be introduced, from 1/1/2023, in the interests of taking trotting forwards.

For 2022, to avoid time-wasting attempts to separate trotting and pacing income at an individual participant level, it has been agreed on HRBGB that TROTBritain will receive 15% of BHRC income from licence fees, as well as 100% of trotters Race Fees and Training Fees. Some of this revenue will be used to purchase office services from the BHRC and other common services that are agreed (such as insurance). Track/association affiliation fees, will remain as BHRC revenue.

In 2022, TROTBritain require all those who wish to participate in a trotting race, in any role or capacity, to take out a TROTBritain licence. However, this will be issued at zero cost, on application, to all BHRC licence holders in good standing and possession of an equivalent BHRC licence for 2022.

TROTBritain will also require all tracks and associations which wish to stage trotting races to apply for a TROTBritain group licence. This does not constitute any form of 'affiliation'. Analogously with individuals, in 2022 we will issue a TROTBritain group licence, on application and at zero cost, to a BHRC-affiliated track or association in good

standing.

Associates

As in the case of most licences (e.g., a driving licence), possession of a TROTBritain licence will simply permit the holder to pursue their occupation or chosen role in trotting legitimately. To contribute to our internal governance and participate in awards and events organised by TROTBritain, they should apply to become a Personal Associate (£10 for 2022) or, in the case of tracks and Associations, a Group Associate (£10 for 2022).

Rules

From 1/1/22 there are separate Pacing and Trotting Rules, formally-speaking. However, TROTBritain has decided to adopt the BHRC rules for 2022, in the absence of specific published rule changes. For the avoidance of any doubt, trotting is run under TROTBritain rules. Changes in relation to qualification of trotters have already been announced.

Integrity/Doping

Extensive discussions are taking place at HRBGB regarding the best way to ensure highest standards in this respect going forwards.

Integrity/Stewarding

TROTBritain intends to appoint a Stipendiary Steward at most meetings with Trotting races. They will also appoint a Gait Steward. Track Stewards will be separately licensed for trotting, by TROTBritain, at a track's request and

will be under the authority of the Stipendiary Steward. They will have no role in relation to gait infringements, so will be acting almost identically to the way they do in pacing races. The BHRC Regional Steward will have no formal role of any sort in relation to trotting, but Regional Steward and Stipe will be expected to co-operate with the other in order to facilitate the conduct of the meeting and the implementation of any agreed common procedures.

Le Trot

While TROTBritain remains the chosen custodian of Le Trot sponsorship of races confined to Trotteurs Français, its status as Governing Body of Trotting Horseracing is a completely separate matter and relates to *all* trotting racing and all trotting breeds.

TROTBritain hopes everyone in both pacing and trotting enjoys the success they are seeking in 2022. And thanks in advance all those whose efforts in all roles will contribute to make it a great season.

Kit Bousfield Centenary Meeting - 24th July

This year this very special man will celebrate a very special birthday - Kit Bousfield is 100 years old in August.

Kit is certainly the patriarch of our sport and in recognition of his contribution to our sport over the decades we plan to hold a one off race meeting - a meeting to remember.

Our basic plan is to have 100 horses, 10 races of 10 horses. We have discussed having an entry fee of approx £100, but with prizemoney of £1000/£250/£100 we feel sure everybody will want to enter.

We will be looking for sponsors for our races, each sponsor will have their name mentioned, but will also include the name of Kit's 10 favourite horses.

Sponsorship will cost £350 per race. We would like to thank all those who have already offered to sponsor a race.

INTEGRITY UPDATE

She's Treacherous – Corbiewood – 13th August and 12th September

Further to the test result received by BHRC from Laboratoire des Courses Hippiques for analysis of the sample taken from the horse She's Treacherous at Corbiewood on 13th August and 12th September, whereby positive tests were returned for the prohibited substance TRIAMCINOLONE ACETONIDE which under BHRC rules is identified in the Uniform Classification Guidelines for foreign substances as a Class 4 Category C Prohibited Substance.

A hearing was conducted by Zoom by an Independent Panel according to Section Y of the BHRC Rules and Regulations. The BHRC can now confirm that this matter has been brought to a conclusion and that the following penalties have been applied in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the BHRC.

Penalties

Mr Jack Foody was found to be in breach (on both occasions) of Rule 1 and as such:

The horse She's Treacherous to be disqualified from the race on the 13th August and that all prize money be forfeited.

Mr Jack Foody's licence as a trainer to be suspended (Category B) for period 6 weeks (for each offence – to run concurrently) as from 17th April 2022 to 28th May 2022. During this period Mr Foody will be banned

from entering any horses to race/take part in any official BHRC event (including qualifiers) but will be permitted to carry out duties in the preparation and caring for horses in his stable.

Mr Jack Foody as trainer of the horse fined the sum of £900.

Mr Jack Foody to pay the sum of £1900 to the BHRC for all costs incurred in relation to this matter.

The horse She's Treacherous will be disqualified from the races of 13th August and 12th September and all prizemoney forfeited and that the handicap penalties incurred on the day be retained on the handicap allocated to the horse.

The horse She's Treacherous will be required to undertake a further integrity test, prior to being entered to race, which must prove negative for all prohibited substances. This test to be at the cost of the Responsible Person.

All findings are for this case only

All Trainers are reminded of their responsibility to maintain an accurate and up-to-date

Treatment /Medical Record Book.

Failure to do so under Rule 15 of Y Section of BHRC Rules and Guidelines could lead to an automatic £1000 fine.

INTEGRITY UPDATE

EVENWOOD HUSTLER 30 May 2021

Having heard from legal representatives from both parties, the Chairman of the Independent External Disciplinary Panel of the BHRC hereby makes the following Order:

- (1) On 30 May 2021, the horse Evenwood Hustler trained by Mr Matthew Quinn was the subject of an anti-doping control conducted by the BHRC.
- (2) The sample of blood taken from
 Evenwood Hustler was subsequently sent for
 analysis and returned positive for peptides
 VNFYWK(T6) and VYSNFLR(T17), both of
 which are specifics of recombinant human
 erythropoietin and analogs (EPO) both of
 which are a Class 1 Category A prohibited
 substance identified in the Uniform
 Classification Guidelines.

PENALTIES

Mr Quinn has admitted breaches of Rules 1, 14 and 15 and as such:

The horse Evenwood Hustler will be disqualified from races run on 30 May 2021 at Appleby Spring with ALL prize money forfeited and ALL handicap penalties incurred on the day be retained on the handicap allocated to the horse.

In respect of the Rule 1 breach – immediate suspension of all Mr Quinn's licences (Category A) for a period of two years (from 9 Mar 2022- 9 Mar 2024) and a fine of £5,000 (the penalty range being £2,000-£5,000). Mr Quinn will not be entitled to any other form of licence during his period of suspension, and Mr Quinn has agreed that

any licence held by Mr Quinn issued by any other governing body of harness racing will not be recognised by the BHRC in respect of harness racing that takes place within the BHRC's jurisdiction during the period of his

In respect of the Rule 14 breach – a fine of £3,000 (penalty range £1000-£3000).

suspension.

In respect of the Rule 15 breach – a fine of £1,000 (set fine £1000).

The horse Evenwood Hustler will be suspended from running in any race for a period of one year from the date of this Order (9 Mar 2022) and will be subject to integrity testing by the BHRC at the cost of Mr Quinn (whether or not he is then the Responsible Person for the horse) prior to it being permitted to return to racing at the end of the period of the horse's suspension.

Mr Matthew Quinn to pay the sum of £1500 towards BHRC costs involved in relation to this matter.

In addition Mr Quinn has agreed to a good

behaviour bond which will run from the date of this Order (9 Mar 2022) and continue for a period of two years by which Mr Quinn has specifically agreed and undertaken that he will be bound by and will comply with all the obligations imposed on a licence holder under the Rules and Regulations of the BHRC as to conduct and that he agrees that he will be subject to disciplinary proceedings as if he were a licensed person in the event of any alleged breach of the Rules and Regulations of the BHRC for a period of two years.

All licence holders who pay the £50 Annual Registration fee are entitled to attend.


Meetings will be held by ZOOM so that people do not have to travel. Licence holders will need to pre-register.

CORBIEWOOD - the







A New Year, but not a good start with the news that has been threatened for so long, but which we all thought (or hoped) would never come, the closure of Corbiewood.

What Corbiewood lacked in facilities it made up for in heart and most people connected to our sport will have fond memories of trips to the 'Citadel of harness racing'. There was always a good feeling at the track, never more so when the Irish came over. It seemed fitting therefore to ask Bernard McGovern for a piece on his local track, the beloved Citadel.

Corbiewood began in 1965 as a training facility for brothers Jimmy and Danny Taylor. However, the closure of the Quarry Park venue accelerated Corbiewood to racecourse status and on 14th July 1966 it opened its doors with a 6 race card.

Legendary driver John Menzies drove the first winner for his father-in-law Bill Cowan on the trotter Algau, whilst Jim Pearson drove the first pacer, Sandy to win race 2. Crowds were so large Central Scotland Police had to stop traffic to allow folk out of Corbiewood. Programme sellers on the first night were Danny Reynolds and (a very young) Ron Caddies. Thursday was the night of choice for racing at Corbiewood, but we have seen racing on other days of the year, in fact, one season it was on Thursday and Saturday.

There have been numerous families linked to this little track with a huge heart, including but not limited to the likes of the Allan Brothers, the Kerrs, the Moncrieffs, Cowan/Menzies, and many, many more. The English raiders came from near and far the likes of the Lowthers, Peter Bailey and the Bousfield brothers all making regular appearances.

Citadel of harness racing

They brought some terrific horses over the years such as Tiny Trews which took home many wins in the early 60. Numerous terrific stables from over the border included Arthur and Evelyn Slack with a variety of the Stoneriggs horses from including the superstar racemare Monkroyd Mystery. Other superstars made the trip over the border included: Golden Dale, Kohima, Missing Link, etc. Whilst Scotland also had its own superstars the likes of Robin Red, Shandy Hill, Astounding, Dreamfair Samurai, Slingshot Scoot who all made regular appearances around the smallest hard track in the UK.

Many great drivers raced around the Citadel with the terrific legendary jousts between Willie Faichney and John Menzies. Other greats to drive around the track and in no particular order were Willie Greenhorn, Hugh and Greg Menzies, Ian Bell, Mick Lord, Sandy Cassells, Alan Haythorntwaite, John Blissett, John Richardson, J.Murdock, Steve Lees, Gordon Gilvear, Ronnie Harrop, and far too many others to mention but who understood the track and drove it accordingly.

Track trainer expat Scotsman now living in Cymru James McInally who was a massive loss when he left and moved over two borders - he regularly put 6 or more horses on the card at each meeting.

Original Bookmakers back in '66 were Jimmy Hepburn, Tommy Thomson, George Shaw,Bert Jenkins, Joe Archer and Tommy James to name a few. There was only Steve Jacobs, John Smart, Brian Edwards and Bernard McGovern who saw it out to the final meeting. Many books came and went such as Napper, Alex



Smith, Peter Storey, Tom Laurie, Steve Reid, Robert Ellison and quite a few others who tried - I'm sure we all have memories of placing our bets (and hopefully collecting our winnings) from at least one of them! The only bookmaker to drive a winner at Corbiewood was Irishman Dan Carlin who won on Brigid the Midget.

Original commentator James Merrilees Miller resplendent in Highland dress used to greet racegoers as the came in to the track. Subsequent race-callers were Wm, Pow Wallace, but the voice of Corbiewood and the best was Davy Douglas who in many opinion was an all time great. To the younger ones amongst us, he is the voice of Corbiewood.

The end of racing at the Citadel of harness racing was a body blow to all the stalwart followers who made their weekly pilgrimage there, nor more so that to the folk who were at the first and last meeting lan Bell, Bernard McGovern and Beel Faichney.

We have also in the past had some terrific sponsors none better than David Morton who incidentally last year gave the followers of trotting a visit back to the past halcyon days when his widow Wilma put on the David Morton day which was the best day in many years. It would hardly be fair to not also mention the hardworking committee of Karen Kennedy, Fred Hay, Willie Paterson, Mitchel I Oag, Robert Govan, Rhonda Clark Milne, Nuala Goodman and Hayley Cassells, not to forget Cathy Shields and Rhonda Clark Milne for their generous donations of hot and cold drinks in lockdown.

As we started with the first winning driver being John Menzies it is somewhat fitting to finish with the last winning driver who was George Carson on racemare J.Ms Macy Hallstar.

When exiting Corbiewood on the last meeting in 2021 it was not in anybodies thoughts that this was the swansong.

Thank you for the great memories Corbiewood.

NOTICE TO ALL TRAINERS (Public, Licence or Permit)

Due to insurance restrictions please ensure that all your helpers and staff have a BHRC licence.

This may be an owners licence, drivers licence, assistant trainers licence or grooms licence.

Any unlicenced person in a licensed area, including the paddock and lorry park could be asked to leave. This is because without a licence they have no insurance. Children under 12 must be accompanied by a licensed adult at all times.

BHRC Flu Vaccination Programme



The BHRC are using 2022 as a transition period but from 2023 will require horses to have 6 monthly boosters.

THIS YEAR (2022)

Primary course intervals (horses not previously vaccinated):

Primary course intervals are only required for horses that have not yet been administered a primary course or are required to restart a new primary course.

An initial primary course of three vaccinations must be given (V1, V2 and V3): the second vaccination (V2) must now be administered within **21-60** days of the first vaccination.

Horses must not attend any official BHRC fixture/venue until 7 days after the second vaccination of the primary course.

Vaccine 3 (V3) must then be administered within **120-180 days** of the administration of the second vaccination (V2).

Boosters should be administered no more than **6** calendar months apart, according to calendar months rather than a fixed number of days. For example, a horse that is fully vaccinated on 01 January would require a booster on or before 01 July.

Horses that have already completed a flu vaccination programme:

Horses that have a compliant primary course and compliant subsequent boosters up to and including 31 December 2021 do not have to re-start the vaccination process.

We ask that trainers seek to move to the new vaccination schedule as soon as practicable.


However, to help trainers implement the changes with minimal disruption to training, horses should be fully compliant with the new requirements by 01 January 2023.


This means that:


before 01 January 2023, for **previously vaccinated horses**, race entry will not be refused on the ground of having not yet commenced six-monthly boosters.

after 01 January 2023 (i.e.) all horses must have been administered a booster within six months of 01 January 2023.
